



Evangeline Bauer

September 25, 1913 - June 1, 2016

Evangeline Bauer passed away on June 1, 2016. Born September 25, 1913, on a dairy farm in Hilbert, Wisconsin she was the second of six children born to Francis and Catherine Wolf.

When she was 6 years old the family moved west. They traveled by touring car along the Yellowstone Trail and camped at night. At the end of the trail, her father purchased a wheat farm near Uniontown, Washington. Life on the farm involved doing household chores and caring for her younger siblings.

After high school, Evangeline studied pharmacy at Washington State University. It was while working at a drug store in Uniontown during the depression that she met Lawrence Bauer, an engineer.

They married in 1935 and moved to Spokane and then to Portland where Lawrence worked for Public Utilities. In 1947 Lawrence accepted a job with Central Lincoln PUD and they moved to Newport.

Together they raised 2 children. Evangeline's life was centered around her home and family. She was an avid gardener and an active member of her church. She was part of the planning, fund-raising and building of the current Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Newport and volunteered for many parish activities and programs.

Evangeline was preceded in death by her husband in 1971. She is survived by her children; Ronald and Marilyn, and by her 8 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren.
