Robert Frederick Foley of Toledo, Oregon passed away May 20, 2016 at the age of 94. He was born October 15, 1921 in Portland, Oregon to Helen Mary Hamill and Harry Augustiv Foley. He moved several times during his childhood. His favorite being a 137 acre farm on the Elocoman River near Cathlamet, WA, where he lived for seven years until age 15. He graduated from Franklin High School in Portland. Other schooling included Carpentry apprenticeship program.

He was a World War II veteran; building bridges and plane runways in the South Pacific. He worked for the Department of Interior on the Alaska Railroad. Other occupations included Carpenter, pile driver, mill pond worker, logger, security, and farmer.

Robert married Janice Greenlee-Gish December 9, 1955 in Toledo, Oregon after they met at the Grange dance. They were married for 60 years and had three sons; Bill, Rory and Kelly. They lived at the same address in the county for 57 years, referring to it as his Shangri-La. He is survived by his wife, sons, daughter-in-law, five grandchildren, and 4 great-grandchildren.
